A great wine on a legendary terroir: It is said that Charlemagne's nephew, Roland de Roncevaux, launched his javelin into the waters of the Gironde from the top of a hill a short distance from the town of Blaye. The year was 775. Having thus proved his valour and strength, he set out on a quest. Making up the rear guard of Charlemagne's army, he was killed at Roncevaux.
